TOWN OF WADENA
 PROVINCE OF SASKATCHEWAN
 BYLAW NO. 11/98

A BYLAW OF THE TOWN OF WADENA, TO DESIGNATE A SITE AS MUNICIPAL HERITAGE PROPERTY.

WHEREAS Sections 11 and 12 of The Heritage Property Act authorize the Council of a Municipality to enact bylaws to designate real property, including all buildings, features and structures thereon, to be of heritage value; and,

WHEREAS the Council of the Municipality has determined that the lands and premises known as:

Wadena Glass and Mye Signs,

and located at:

93 Main Street North

is a site of architectural, historical, cultural, environmental, archaeological, palaeontological, aesthetic and/or scientific value; and,

WHEREAS the Council of the Municipality has caused, not less than thirty (30) days prior to consideration of this bylaw, a Notice of Intention to Designate to be:

- a) served on the owners of said property;
- b) served on the Registrar of Heritage Property;
- c) registered on the Certificate of Title for said property in the appropriate Land Titles Office; and,

WHEREAS no Notice of Objection to the proposed designation has been served on the Council of the Municipality;

THEREFORE, the Council of the Municipality enacts as follows:

1. There is designated as Municipal Heritage Property the real property legally described as:

FIRSTLY:

The Whole of Lot 2, Block 15, Plan C2572
 Wadena, Saskatchewan.

SECONDLY:

All that portion of Lot 3 described as follows:

Commencing at the point on the East limit of the Lot Northerly 7.925 metres from the South East corner; thence Westerly parallel with the North limit 30.48 metres; thence Northerly parallel with the West limit to the intersection with the North limit; thence Easterly along the North limit, to the North East corner; thence Southerly along the East limit to the point of commencement.

CERTIFIED A TRUE COPY of Bylaw No. 11/98 adopted by resolution of Council on the 8th day of September, 1998.




The reasons for the designation are as follows:

Red Brick building constructed in 1921 and once occupied by the Sterling Standard Bank.

 - b) served on the owners of said property.

3. The Municipal Administrator is hereby authorized to cause a certified copy of this bylaw to be served on the Registrar or Heritage Property.
