### Friendly Reminder to Pet Owners:

1) Every owner of a cat or dog that is over 4 months old shall within 30 days of becoming the owner obtain a license for each cat or dog. (Bylaw No. 14-18, Section 5.1)

2) No owner of a cat or dog shall permit the cat or dog to be at large, except in any of the off-leash areas.

(Bylaw No. 14-18, Section 9.1)

3) No owner of a dog shall permit or allow the dog to become a nuisance to other persons or animals in an off-leash area.

(Bylaw No. 14-18, Section 10.3a)

### Regulations:

1. Tree branches must be out in the same location of your garbage pick up by 8:00 am.
2. This service does not include pick up of household items or junk.
3. Tree branches will be picked up free-of-charge ONLY when the amount is no longer than half-ton size load. Loads larger than that size will be subject to a pick up fee of \$50 per load.
4. Branches cannot exceed 4 feet in length and 3 inches in diameter.

# Saving Water Will Save You Money!

It is important for residents to check for water leaks in their home - no one wants to pay for something they don't use! Even the smallest water leak has the potential of causing a large utility bill. The majority of leaks occur in the bathroom and the most common culprit is the toilet. Residents can see if their toilet is leaking by:

- Putting a few drops of food colouring into the toilet tank
- Waiting 15 minutes
- Checking if the water in the toilet bowl has changed colour

If the water has changed colour, the toilet is leaking. The most common cause of a leaking toilet is a worn out flapper valve.

Dripping faucets are another common source of water leaks. In some cases, fixing them can be as easy as tightening the taps. Plumbers can also assist in fixing any water leaks.

## How to Care for Your Septic System?

### Toilets aren't trash cans!

Your septic system is not a trash can. An easy rule of thumb: Do not flush anything besides human waste and toilet paper. Never flush:

- Cooking grease or oil
- Non-flushable wipes, such as baby wipes or other wet wipes
- Photographic solutions
- Feminine hygiene products
- Condoms
- Dental floss
- Diapers
- Cigarette butts
- Coffee grounds
- Cat litter
- Paper towels
- Pharmaceuticals
- Household chemicals like gasoline, oil, pesticides, antifreeze, and paint or paint thinners

### Think at the sink!

Your septic system contains a collection of living organisms that digest and treat household waste. Pouring toxins down your drain can kill these organisms and harm your septic system. Whether you are at the kitchen sink, bathtub, or utility sink:

- Avoid chemical drain openers for a clogged drain. Instead, use boiling water or a drain snake.
- Never pour cooking oil or grease down the drain.
- Never pour oil-based paints, solvents, or large volumes of toxic cleaners down the drain. Even latex paint waste should be minimized.
- Eliminate or limit the use of a garbage disposal. This will significantly reduce the amount of fats, grease, and solids that enter your septic tank and ultimately clog its drain field.
